20 The California Corporations Commissioner (“Commissioner”) finds that Respondent has
21 not paid the annual assessment as required by California Financial Code Section 23016, although
22 notification to pay the assessment was duly sent on or about May 20, 2008. Respondent was
23 notified on July 23, 2008 by certified mail, return receipt requested that payment of the
24 assessment plus the penalty must be paid no later than August 6, 2008 to avoid revocation of the
25 California Deferred Deposit Transaction Law license.

26 THEREFORE, GOOD CAUSE APPEARING, Respondent’s California Deferred Deposit
27 Transaction Law license is hereby revoked effective December 22, 2008 pursuant to California
28 Financial Code Section 23016 (c), unless the annual assessment is received in good funds by the

1 Department of Corporations Accounting Office located on 1515 K. Street, Suite 200,
2 Sacramento, California 95814, no later than the close of business on December 19, 2008. On
3 the effective date of this ORDER, if the annual assessment has not been paid, you are hereby
4 ordered and directed to discontinue engaging in the business of deferred deposit transactions
5 subject to the California Deferred Deposit Transaction Law.

6 This ORDER is to remain in full force and effect until the further written order of the
7 Commissioner of Corporations.

9 California Financial Code section 23016 (c) provides as follows:

10
11 If a licensee fails to pay the assessment on or before the 30th day of June
12 following the day upon which payment is due, the commissioner may by order
13 summarily suspend or revoke the certificate issued to the licensee. If, after an
14 order is made, a request for hearing is filed in writing within 30 days, and a
15 hearing is not held within 60 days thereafter, the order is deemed rescinded as of
16 its effective date. During any period when its certificate is revoked or suspended,
17 a licensee shall not conduct business pursuant to this division except as may be
18 permitted by order of the commissioner. However, the revocation, suspension or
19 surrender of a certificate shall not affect the powers of the commissioner as
20 provided in this division.
