21	The Commissioner of Business Oversight (Commissioner), and Longbridge Financial, LLC			
22	(Longbridge) (collectively, the Parties), enter into this Consent Order with respect to the following			
23	facts:			
24	RECITALS			
25	A. Longbridge is a residential mortgage lender licensed by the Commissioner since July 12, 2013			
26	pursuant to the California Residential Mortgage Lending Act (Fin. Code, § 50000 et seq.) (CRMLA).			
27	Longbridge has its principal place of business located at One International Boulevard, Suite 900,			
28	Mahwah, New Jersey 07495. Longbridge employs mortgage loan originators in its CRMLA business.			
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B. On January 12, 2017, the Department of Business Oversight (Department) posted a licensing			
item on the Nationwide Mortgage Licensing System and Registry (NMLS) requesting that			
Longbridge submit an Application for Change of License Authority in order to add mortgage loan			
servicing authority to its CRMLA license. On March 13, 2017, Longbridge submitted the requested			
materials in order to add servicing authority under the CRMLA. The materials requested for			
servicing authority have been pending with the Department. At all times Longbridge believed and			
believes that it was and is in full compliance with the CRMLA and Departmental requirements and			
requests.			

- C. During a regulatory examination that commenced on September 15, 2017, the Department confirmed that Longbridge acts as a master servicer (while delegating its duties to a licensed subservicer to perform all day-to-day servicing functions on such loans), which the Department considers to constitute engaging in the business of servicing loans without a license, in violation of Financial Code section 50002, subdivision (a).
- D. The Department, through the Commissioner, has jurisdiction over the licensing and regulation of persons and entities engaged in the business of lending and/or servicing pursuant to the CRMLA, including mortgage loan originators.
- E. It is the intention and desire of the Parties to resolve this Action without the necessity of a hearing and/or other litigation.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing, and the terms and conditions set forth herein, the parties agree as follows:

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 1. Purpose. This Consent Order resolves the issues before the Commissioner concerning unlicensed servicing activity by Longbridge set forth in paragraph C, above, in a manner that avoids the expense of a hearing and other possible court proceedings, protects consumers, is in the public interest, and is consistent with the purposes, policies, and provisions of the CRMLA.
- 2. Order to Discontinue Violations. Longbridge agrees that in accordance with Financial Code section 50321, it will immediately discontinue any violations set forth herein.
 - 3. Final Order to Discontinue. Longbridge agrees that the Order to Discontinue

Violations as described in Paragraph 2 above is hereby deemed a final order.

4. <u>Administrative Fee</u>. Longbridge agrees to pay an administrative fee of \$40,000.00 (the "Fee") to cover examination and investigation costs and attorney's fees. The Fee shall be paid to the Commissioner within 30 days of the Effective Date of this Consent Order as defined in paragraph 25. The payment shall be made payable in the form of a cashier's check or Automated Clearing House deposit to the "Department of Business Oversight," and transmitted to the attention of:

Notice of payment shall be sent to:

In the event the payment due date falls on a weekend or holiday, the payment shall be due the next business day.

- 5. <u>Approval of Application</u>. The Commissioner hereby acknowledges that the mortgage loan servicer application filed by Longbridge is ready to be approved, and the Commissioner hereby agrees to approve the application concurrently with the execution of this Consent Order.
- 6. <u>Waiver of Hearing Rights</u>: Longbridge acknowledges the Commissioner is ready, willing, and able to proceed with the filing of an administrative enforcement action on the charges contained in this Consent Order. Longbridge hereby waives the right to any hearings, and to any reconsideration, appeal, or other right to review which may be afforded pursuant to the CRMLA, the California Administrative Procedure Act, the California Code of Civil Procedure, or any other provision of law. Longbridge further expressly waives any requirement for the filing of an Accusation pursuant to Government Code section 11415.60, subdivision (b). By waiving such rights, Longbridge effectively consents to this Consent Order and Order to Discontinue Violations becoming final.

- 7. <u>Full and Final Settlement:</u> The Parties hereby acknowledge and agree that this Consent Order is intended to constitute a full, final and complete resolution of the matters addressed herein, and that no further proceedings or actions will be brought by the Commissioner in connection with these matters under any other provision of law, excepting therefrom any proceeding to enforce compliance with the terms of this Consent Order.
- 8. <u>Failure to Comply with Consent Order.</u> Longbridge agrees that if it fails to comply with the terms of this Consent Order, the Commissioner may, in addition to all other available remedies it may invoke under the CRMLA, summarily suspend/revoke the CRMLA licenses of Longbridge until Longbridge is in compliance. Longbridge waives any notice and hearing rights to contest such summary suspensions which may be afforded under the CRMLA, the California Administrative Procedure Act, the California Code of Civil Procedure, or any other provision of law in connection therewith.
- 9. <u>Third Party Actions.</u> It is the intent and understanding between the parties that this Consent Order does not create any private rights or remedies against Longbridge or create any liability for Longbridge or limit defenses of Longbridge for any person or entity not a party to this Agreement.
- 10. <u>Information Willfully Withheld.</u> This Consent Order may be revoked and the Commissioner may pursue any and all remedies available under law against Longbridge if the Commissioner discovers that Longbridge knowingly or willfully withheld information used for and relied upon in this Consent Order.
- 11. <u>Future Actions by Commissioner</u>. If Longbridge fails to comply with any terms of the Consent Order, the Commissioner may institute proceedings for any and all violations otherwise resolved under this Consent Order. The Commissioner reserves the right to bring any future actions against Longbridge, or any of its partners, owners, officers, shareholders, directors, employees or successors for any and all unknown violations of the CRMLA.
- 12. <u>Assisting Other Agencies</u>. Nothing in this Consent Order limits the Commissioner's ability to assist any other government agency (city, county, state, or federal) with any prosecution,

administrative, civil or criminal brought by that agency against Longbridge or any other person based upon any of the activities alleged in this matter or otherwise.

- 13. <u>Independent Legal Advice</u>. Each of the parties represents, warrants, and agrees that it has received or been advised to seek independent legal advice from its attorneys with respect to the advisability of executing this Consent Order.
- 14. No Other Representation. Each of the parties represents, warrants, and agrees that in executing this Consent Order, it has relied solely on the statements set forth herein and the advice of its own counsel. Each of the parties further represents, warrants, and agrees that in executing this Consent Order, it has placed no reliance on any statement, representation, or promise of any other party, or any other person or entity not expressly set forth herein, or upon the failure of any party or any other person or entity to make any statement, representation or disclosure of anything whatsoever. The Parties have included this clause: (1) to preclude any claim that any party was in any way fraudulently induced to execute this Consent Order; and (2) to preclude the introduction of parol evidence to vary, interpret, supplement, or contradict the terms of this Consent Order.
- 15. <u>Full Integration</u>. This Consent Order is the final written expression and the complete and exclusive statement of all the agreements, conditions, promises, representations, and covenants between the Parties with respect to the subject matter hereof, and supersedes all discussions between and among the Parties, their respective representatives, and any other person or entity, with respect to the subject matter covered hereby.
- No Presumption From Drafting. In that the Parties have had the opportunity to draft, review and edit the language of this Consent Order, and no presumption for or against any party arising out of drafting all or any part of this Consent Order will be applied in any action relating to, connected to, or involving this Consent Order. Accordingly, the Parties waive the benefit of Civil Code section 1654 and any successor or amended statute, providing that in cases of uncertainty, language of a contract should be interpreted most strongly against the party who caused the uncertainty to exist.
- 17. <u>Voluntary Consent</u>. Longbridge enters into this Consent Order voluntarily and without coercion and acknowledges that no promises, threats or assurances have been made by the

Commissioner or any officer, or agent thereof, about this Consent Order. The Parties	each represe	ent
and acknowledge that he, she or it is executing this Consent Order completely volunta	rily and with	hout
any duress or undue influence of any kind from any source.		
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- 18. <u>Modifications and Qualified Integration</u>. No amendment, change or modification of this Consent Order shall be valid or binding in any extent unless it is in writing and signed by all of the parties affected by it.
- 19. <u>Waiver</u>. The waiver of any provision of this Consent Order shall not operate to waive that provision in the future, or waive any other provision set forth herein, and any waiver, amendment and/or change to the terms of this Consent Order must be in writing and signed by the parties affected by it.
- 20. <u>Successors in Interest</u>. This Consent Order is binding on all heirs, assigns and/or successors in interest.
- 21. <u>Counterparts.</u> This Consent Order may be executed in any number of counterparts by the Parties, and when each party has signed and delivered at least one such counterpart to the other party, each counterpart shall be deemed an original and taken together shall constitute one and the same Consent Order.
- 22. <u>Signatures</u>. This Consent Order may be executed by facsimile or scanned signature, and any such facsimile or scanned signature by any party hereto shall be deemed to be an original signature and shall be binding on such party to the same extent as if such facsimile or scanned signature were an original signature.
- 23. <u>Governing Law</u>. This Consent Order shall be construed and enforced in accordance with and governed by California law.
- 24. <u>Public Record.</u> Longbridge hereby acknowledges that this Consent Order will be a matter of public record.
- 25. <u>Notice</u>. Any notices required under this Consent Order shall be provided to each party at the following addresses:
